You can convert multiple jpgs into a single pdf on Ubuntu Linux using ImageMagick like so:

```
$ convert *.jpg out.pdf
```

The problem with this is that it segfaults for me using jpegs, and if I use PNGs the resulting file is way too large. So I did some searching and found an even better tool for the job. It's called [gscan2pdf](#) and works flawlessly with jpeg images and lets you set all sorts of output options for the pdf.

Since it has a GUI it's also very easy to use. It's in the Ubuntu repository already, so all you need is:

```
$ apt-get install gscan2pdf
```

Great job [gscan2pdf](#) developers!
